


ACTS 2 VISION

Acts 2 Community

What was the strength of the Acts 2 church? Community

This passage is our standard, our evaluation of whether we are reaching the goal in our church. Is our church fostering and experiencing the characteristics of the Acts 2 church? Here are the areas to focus on:

Fellowship: The core of the Christian Life is fellowship with God, authentic relationship with One Another

Fellowship looks like:

- Everyone is involved
- Taking time for interaction

We don't go right into the curriculum, program, or meeting when everyone shows up but allow time for conversation and relationships to grow.

- We are connecting with each other outside our life or ministry groups Kids from our ministry had a big baseball game last weekend and several members of our ministry group went to the game to support him.
- Everyone knows everyone's name
- We are making a point to know and meet the personal needs of others
 One of our members' husband had to spend three days at the hospital so we all took turns taking care of their kids.
- We eat together
- We are genuine with each other
- We consider all our possessions to be available for anyone that may need something.

 One of the families in our ministry was moving last week, so we came with our trucks to help them move all their items to their new home.
- Unity--all things in common

 We realize, regardless of our backgrounds, Christ has brought us together and we all share in His salvation.



Acts 2 Community

Teaching: To instruct each other in the incredible truth of God's Word

Teaching looks like:

• We teach them Bible

We use the Bible as we go through the curriculum or gather for a meeting

- We stay on track with the curriculum
- Our teaching cultivates everyone's spiritual journey
 We ask questions that move people to understand God's word better
- We are all open to learning, allowing discussions and questions. As the teacher I provide challenging, reflective, and thought-provoking insights every week.

This last week I challenged everyone to memorize the verse from the lesson.

• We allow ourselves to be authentic with each other as we learn.

A couple shared struggles they were having with the in-laws.

Prayer: The prayer is our communication with God personally and corporately.

Prayer looks like:

- We take prayer requests
- We rejoice in answered prayer

We prayed that one of our members could find a job and we rejoiced when the Lord provided.

- We uplift the needs of others during a time of prayer together
- We pray not just for those in our groups but for those in our church, jobs, families, etc...
- We challenge our members to pray throughout the week
- We check up on prayer requests throughout the week
- We have agreed to pray for someone that we know that doesn't know the Lord A friend of mine at work, Charlie, doesn't know the Lord and I have committed myself to pray for him and opportunity to witness to him.

Worship: Is to fulfill our creative duty in proclaiming that the Lord is great and worthy of all our praise.

Worship looks like:

- We sing praises to the Lord
- We worship the Lord in service with our group, team, or ministry members
- We have created an atmosphere of worship
- We worship as a group in breaking of bread
- We celebrate new babies, healing, accomplishments...etc.
- We celebrate with our members in their blessings


We celebrated together when the Lord provided a new child to our family.

It's a great way to get more out of reading your Bible, and allows you to record your thoughts, emotions and the revelation you receive from God's Word. As beneficial as the bible is, you only benefit from it based on what you do with it

Getting Started

- Time and Place: Find a quiet time and space to read your Bible, preferably at the same time each day. Many people find that reading scripture in the morning helps get their day off to a focused start.
- 2. What to Read: You can follow a reading plan through the entire Bible, or the New Testament. Or you can select one book of the Bible to work through at a time. If you don't know where to start, pick a Gospel (Matthew, Mark, Luke, or John), and then work your way through it and on through the rest of the New Testament.
- 3. Use a Journal: You can use a paper journal, or electronically record your daily entries.
- 4. Time Breakdown: 1/3 Bible 1/3 Journal 1/3 Prayer

Read meditatively and thoughtfully through a portion of Scripture. Pick a verse or two that stood out to you and write it in your journal.

Observation

Now write some observations about the verse(s) or passage. What is this passage or verse saying? About God? About people? How is Christ revealed in this?

Application

Now write a few sentences on how this passage applies to your life. Is there truth about God that you are to believe? A promise to receive? Is the Holy Spirit convicting you of something you need to do or stop doing in light of God's truth?

What specific principle are you challenged to practice based on Scripture, prayer, and reflection? Be doers of the word and not merely hearers. (James 1:22)

Prayer

Now write out a prayer to God in response to this Scripture. This is a way to turn God's Word to you back to Him. Be honest and express your heart to Him. God always listens and He delights in your prayers. (Psalm 34:15; Proverbs 15:8)

We Believe In...

The Godhead. We believe that the Godhead exists eternally in three persons – the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. They are co-equal, coeternal and one God. (**Gen 1:1-3; 26; John 1:1; Matt 3:16-17; Heb. 1:1-3**)

The Person and Work of the Lord Jesus Christ. We believe that Jesus Christ came into this world that He might reveal God to men, fulfill prophecy, and become Savior of the lost. (Phil 2:5-8; Luke 19:10; Matt 5:17-18)

We further believe that He died on the cross for the sins of the world, was buried and arose from the dead according the scriptures. (1 Cor. 15:3-4; John 20:20)

The Scriptures. We believe that all "Scripture is given by inspiration of God" and is designed for our practical instruction. (2 Timothy 3:16; Rom. 15:4)

Salvation Only through Jesus Christ. We believe that the new birth of the believer comes only through faith in Christ and not according to any measure of human works, such as confession, baptism, prayer, or faithful service. (**John 3:16-19; Rom. 1:16-17; Eph 2:8-9**).

The Holy Spirit. We believe that the Holy Spirit, indwells in every believer at the moment of conversion and His baptism unites all believers to Christ in one body. There is no subsequent baptism of the spirit. (John 14:16-17; 16:7-15; Eph. 4:4-6; 30)

Eternal Security. We believe that all true believers everywhere, once saved are eternally secure, sealed by the Holy Spirit and shall be kept forever. (**John 5:24; 10:27-30; Eph. 1:13-14**)

The Christian Walk. We believe that we are called to live Holy, empowered by the indwelling Holy Spirit, so that we do not fulfill the lust and desires of the flesh. (**John 14:16-17; 1 Cor. 6:19-20; Gal. 5:16-23**)

The Christian's Service. We believe that all believers are endowed with one gift. While there is a diversity of gifts, each believer is energized by the same Spirit, and each is called to utilize their gift to serve faithfully and glorify God. (1 Peter 4:10; Eph. 4:11; 1 Cor. 12:4-11 Rom 12:6)

Membership

Membership is available to anyone who has placed their faith in Jesus

Christ as Lord and Savior and is the only Provision given for the

forgiveness of sins and eternal life.

The general responsibilities to be considered an active member in good standing in this church, are the following:

- Members regularly and consistently give, serve, grow, and support the activities of this Church.
- Members must serve in at least one ministry area.
- Members are advised to participate in at least 2 of the 3 annual Life Group sessions.


Management of the Church Board of Elders

BAPTISM

When people consider the topic of Baptism, two categories of questions are often asked. The first is a very basic one: "What is the spiritual significance of baptism?" The second has to do with traditions from the past—specifically, pre-conversion baptism. The issue in that case is, "Why be baptized as an adult believer when I was baptized as a baby?"

Why Baptize?

- 1. Baptism was commanded by the Lord Jesus Christ: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit" (Matthew 28:19). Baptism is the means by which disciples of Christ are identified.
- 2. Baptism was practiced by the early church. In the book of Acts, believers expressed publicly, through the act of baptism, their inward decision and intent to follow the Lord Jesus Christ. In Acts, it is evident that the act of baptism came after an individual's decision to trust Christ for salvation (Acts 2:28,41; 8:12; 10:47-48). Baptism can't give a person anything, spiritually speaking. It can signify something that has already happened.

Who Should Be Baptized?

Believers/Disciples—The Apostles were commanded to "make disciples of all nations, baptizing them..." One must have the heart to be a follower of Christ. Individuals who trust Christ as their own personal Savior should be baptized.

- 1. Anyone who has not been baptized since becoming a Christian.
- 2. Any Christian who has never clearly understood the meaning of baptism, even thoughthey may have been baptized previously
- 3. Any Christian who desires to recommit their life to Christ



What Does Baptism Mean?

The Apostle Paul says in Romans 6:3-4, "Or do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus have been baptized into His death? Therefore, we have been buried with Him through baptism into death, in order that as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so too we might walk in newness of life."

Life Groups

The Philosophy of Life Groups

Life Groups serve as a weekly gathering of individuals for the purpose of connecting to form friendships, caring for one another, growing spiritually, and contributing to the ministry of the church. Groups will meet for approximately 12weeks at a time (3 sessions per calendar year). In Life Groups, individuals can discover and develop their spiritual gifts, meet needs, heal the hurts, kindle hope, and build their faith. Our Life Groups provide the infrastructure for Christians to grow, be nurtured, develop leadership, and extend the kingdom of God.

NLF's Life Groups embrace the **'The Church of Small Group'** as a model. Life Groups are NOT merely just another thing that we do. Life Groups are what we are. Virtually all of our ministries operate through a small group environment. Essentially, the purpose of the Life Groups is to build the church as a community. Our model sees the larger community as a network of small communities that develop people in Christ. Therefore, our Life Group concept penetrates EVERY area of the church.

The Bible places an emphasis on 'fellowship'. God did not create us to live life alone. We were created for relationship (Gen. 2:18). A community is the gathering of people with a shared common experience and or interest. The Christian community is extremely important as it relates to the 2 primary functions of the church (evangelism & growth). We are united by our faith in Jesus Christ and to others who also have placed their trust in Jesus Christ. The element that ties these 2 areas together is called 'fellowship' (1John 1:1-4) So the Christian community can be defined as:

"What God has called the church to be. Building relational, transforming gatherings, where people are experiencing oneness with God and oneness with one another. An assembly that is so satisfying, so unique, and so compelling that they create a thirst to a watching world" [Andy Stanley]

What is a Life Group?

Life Groups exists to provide opportunities for individuals to connect with others, through common areas of interests, with the overall goal of transforming the way people think, behave, and relate to others, thereby becoming true followers of Jesus Christ.

A Life Group is a gathering of people with a commonality. The various groups are formed out of similar interests, the same season of life, and or a spiritual growth pursuit. So, within these areas, our life groups focus on creative and engaging ways for our members to:

- Come to Love Christ
- ➤ Learning the Bible
- ➤ Learning to live out the Scriptures
- ➤ Addressing stronghold while Pursuing holiness
- Serving their community
- ➤ Witnessing to their neighbors
- > Being known and loved, within the context of community

Life Groups are:

A means by which individuals can CONNECT with one another

A place where CHRIST-LIKE development can occur through spiritual growth

An opportunity to CARE and to be CARED by one another

A means for CONSISTENT accountability

Life Groups are NOT:
